28th Annual Roop County Days 2024 June 22 - 29, 2024

Roop County days will be June 22nd -29th, 2024. Yes you read that right. Seven full days of shooting. The kick-off match on the 22nd will be with the Silver State Shootists up in Virginia City. They will be providing a 6 stage, Big Bore Optional match including a lunch at the historic Bucket of Blood saloon. Then two days (10 stages) of Wild Bunch - Teddy Roosevelt - Doughboy, June 23rd & 24th. But wait there's more, Nevada State Black Powder Championship! "SmokeOut on the Comstock" with two days/10stages of nothing but smoke, fire and fun. June 25th & 26th. Then a day of Long Range, Speed Matches, and YES the President's Pickle Shoot will be there too. Once again sponsored by the "NEVADA Brining Company". The pickle shoot is where every contestant is a winner!!! The next day will bring you RCD 2024 in conjunction with the Western States Tom Horn Championship. Two days, 12 stages of shooting. At the conclusion of the match there will be a catered banquet and awards to the shooters. In addition, a coveted "Shootest Award" will be presented to shooters who sign up for, and shoot all four matches. I have included a photo of last years award. The cost for each shoot should be the

same as last year. Applications should be posted around the first of March and there will be one for each shoot and shooter. We will post them on our Facebook page and web site, notherennevadacas.com. In



addition, we (BBR Board) have decided to go back to our roots and honor the original Tom Horn rules. What this means is the categories and guns are limited to 40 caliber or larger. The only exception is the Bounty Hunter, where it is legal to use 38/357 cal. pistols with a 30/30 rifle. The rules will be posted too. Speaking of RCD 2024, Gold Rush Allie has said that she still needs DONATIONS for the raffle. Please look around all your cowboy stuff and if you find something you no longer use or need, consider donating to the raffle. It would be greatly appreciated. Just an FYI on upcoming shoots, Eldorado Cowboy's have applications out for the Dam Site shoot. Knowing Beaver and company, it will be a good one. Shoot will be April 5 -7, 2024 down in Bolder City. "RCBS Lock Out Die:

Just wanted to pass on some info on a reloading item that works to prevent 'squibs' and overloads. The Lock Out Die takes the place of the 'powder cop' (Hornady) and will work on Dillon, Hornady and Lee progressive presses. NOTE: If you have a Dillon alarm powder level sensor I would continue to use the Dillon. The way it works is, as a powder filled case enters the LO Die, the rod sensor detects the level of powder and if correct, as the die is set up, it will prevent the case from going into the LO die and stop the load. Initial testing shows this LO Die will detect approximately +/-.5 grains out of specs from the desired amount of powder.

I cannot talk to reloading bottle neck cases but this device looks to be a God send for 38 spc, 44-40, 45 Colt, 45 acp, .357 and 38 short Colt. The set up instructions were frustrating initially and several Ytube videos got me up and running. Once you visualize the concept of how it works, setup flows simple.

Cost was about 70 bucks which is cheaper than replacing a gun.

NOTE: Die is standard threads and shown with a Quick Change bushing. "
