By now everyone has heard about SASS's new Wild Bunch Rules. There are several clubs that will no longer hold SASS sanction Wild Bunch matches. So with all the hooplas, complaints, etc. I held a board meeting just to deal with the new rules. Attending were our Wild Bunch coordinator (and assistant), TG, Secretary, Treasurer, and of course yours truly. It was decided since we are a SASS affiliated club and the rules really do not change what we are doing, we will follow the new rules. Part of the change is a new Wild Bunch TG. Wylie Fox said that he would be happy to take on the duties. He will be continuing on as our club Territory Governor. The rule change starts 1,Jan, 2024. It was also decided for RCD 2024 to include an "Open Category" to the Wild Bunch/TR/Doughboy match. Also brought up at this meeting was the need for Range Rules. I have an old copy and will be working on them. Once I have a "working copy" I will bring it to the members to discuss and vote on them. It was pointed out that one rule that should be incorporated in the rules is about resetting targets. Once a match director has set stages, no one should in any way change targets, adjust targets, or make any changes to targets without the express permission from the match director. It is okay to point out safety concerns but it is not okay to make any changes. A number of members have approached me on this subject and wanted me to include it in the range rules.

We did not have a match on Dec. 3rd because of the Christmas party on the 2nd. We did have one on Dec.10th. There were 15 shooters, the weather was clear and cold so we called it a match after 5 stages. iPads were not used so we used an old paper score sheet. I took it home and tried to input it on to my iPad. After some struggles (okay lots of struggles), and calls (only a couple) to Wylie I think i got all the scores entered into the program and sent to Jackpot Jerry to post. It came to mind that it might be a good idea to train a few folks on how to use and help create a "Cheat Sheet" for entering scores on the CAS Scoring program. If there is some interest let me or Wylie know and we can set something up. Just looking for a few members to help share the scoring tasks. So if you would be interested, let us know. In addition, we need stage writers for 2024. We will be making a calendar so please pick a date and help with stage writing. My understanding is there is plenty of help if you have never done this before. So please help your club, pick a date and write some stages. RCD 2024



From your Wild Bunch Coordinator – Flanigan Flats



Howdy all,

I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving and that preparations for Christmas are coming together. We didn't have a Wild Bunch (WB) match in December because of the conflict with the Christmas party. Winter is upon us so please for the next few months I would appreciate if you will RSVP for any upcoming WB match to haleyanthony@hotmail.com and if the decision to cancel any match due to weather concerns is made I will attempt to get the word out as widely and quickly as possible. Our next scheduled WB match is scheduled for 6 January 2024.

This leads us to the new WB rule package that goes into effect on 1 January 2024.

There will be no changes to the requirements or current restrictions in relation to the 1911. Power factor requirement remains at 150 for the 1911.

Any SASS legal rifle in .38 caliber or larger will be added to the approved firearms list for the Traditional and Modern categories. There will be no power factor for any rifle in WB moving forward. Also, any SASS legal shotgun will be added to the approved firearms list for any WB category.

In addition to the Traditional and Modern categories, Teddy Roosevelt (TR) and Doughboy (DB) will be added to the SASS recognized main match categories for WB at any SASS sanctioned match. At the club level there will also now be an Open category. The Open Category will allow any single stack 1911 in any caliber or barrel length (No PF), any SASS legal rifle in .32 caliber or larger, and any SASS legal shotgun.

TR: This category substitutes a rifle caliber lever or pump action rifle for a SASS main match rifle with rifle targets set further out. Rifle caliber lever action or pump action as manufactured before WW1 ended. Rifle caliber is defined as having a minimum 1.8" cartridge case length. The 1895 Winchester and the Savage 99 originals or reproductions along with period correct receiver mounted peep sights are legal for TR.

TR rifles will be loaded at the loading table with no more than the number of rounds specified in the stage description- up to a maximum of 7 rounds and will be staged in accordance with the stage description. Bolt will be fully forward on lever or pump action with the hammer down. Lead bullets will be used. Gas checked bullets are allowed.

DB: The rifle must be an original caliber bolt-action rifle issued by any country to its military forces through the end of WWII. It must be as issued with original iron battle sights and NO external modifications. Internal modifications are allowed. Faithful reproductions are allowed.

DB rifles will be loaded with no more than 5 rounds and will be staged in accordance with the stage description. The bolt will be fully open. Reloads can be loaded individually or with stripper clips. Lead bullets will be used. Gas checked bullets are allowed.

These rules will be in effect for Battle Born Ranger WB matches going forward and I will do my best to make sure that we will have TR and DB friendly stages, so get those safe queens out!! Please send any questions to the e-mail above and I will do my best to get you an answer. If you are curious about WB the pot is now right to give it a try! Come on out and join the fun. If you don't have a 1911 I have a Taurus 1911 and Mernickle WB holster for sale for \$400.

Looking forward to seeing you all at the range.

your thoughts. Some of the comments had to do with having a bonus in the first place. It was suggested that a bonus target should NOT result in negative time, but instead have some "after the match" award/prize. Phantom brings up and interesting point. Once anyone get the 5 second bonus then to stay completive all shooters MUST hit the bonus, otherwise it is effectively a 5 second miss. If the bonus is 10 to 20 seconds, then, like above, it becomes a 10 to 20 second MISS!!!

COWBOY Issues

BBR & SSS members. As your TG I will be casting the club's vote on the following items. One vote each for BBR and SSS. I am requesting to get your vote before January 7th, 2024. Please let me know your choices, by email, phone or at the BBR shoot on Jan 7th. I will summarize the club's choice in the January newsletter.

Items #1 & #2 go together and basically treat the long guns the same. Item #3 is intended to "clean up" an existing rule and try to assist shooters with smaller hands. The proposed changes had a lot of energy on the SASS forum, <u>here</u>.

1. **Remove the SDQ penalty** for **initially staging** a long gun with the hammer cocked/action closed **with no live round in the chamber**.

(verification for rifles- same as for movement from the LT...for shotguns, simply open the action to verify.)

- 2. <u>Add shotguns</u> to the current exception for changing location from the loading table to the stage: Changing location with a long gun with the action closed and the hammer cocked (exception for <u>rifle long guns</u> from the loading table to the stage with no round chambered).
- 3. Remove the subjective verbiage regarding "blocks" from the lever wrap allowance:
 Levers may be wrapped or padded with leather or faux leather. or other natural material.

 Filler "blocks" or other such mechanisms designed to prevent all or drastically limit movement of the fingers within the lever loop are not allowed.

 ("leather" includes suede... "faux leather" would include anything that looks like leather.)

Wild Bunch Issues
