

Due to the CAS Shooters system becoming a "for profit" software we are reviewing the options of paying them an annual fee to remain on that system or switching to PractiScore, which is free and owned by Dillion. Jackpot Jerry and Wylie Fox are evaluating these options for both SSS and BBR.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY (GIVE OR TAKE A FEW)

William Stacy was born in Gloucester, Massachusetts in 1734. He married and raised a large family, eventually resettling in New Salem, Massachusetts. He was a shoemaker or cordwainer by trade, though he may also have invested in banking and merchant shipping, meaning that he was a wealthy man with a financial stake in the American Revolution. He was a Captain in New Salem's militia in April, 1775, when the town responded to the crisis at Lexington and Concord. Alarm bells called the citizens to this green April 20, 1775 to learn of the battle at Lexington. There was indecision until 1st Lt. Stacy stepped forward and said "Fellow soldiers, I don't know how it is with you, but for me I will no longer serve a king that murders my own countrymen." Pulling out his commission from the crown he tore it to bits and trod it underfoot. Amid wild cheers a militia company of patriots was formed and under the gallant Stacy as Captain marched off to Cambridge. May such patriotism ever be with us. He was later one of the two officers during the siege of Bunker Hill and several other major battles during the Revolution.

So began our Constitutional Democratic Republic. Happy 4th of July.
