Pistolcenter to inside targets. 2nd pistol-center to outside targets. Left to right. Rifle targets-center to inside, the center to out- side with the last on the big target. Shotgun center to left then center to right.

Stage 3 were Nevada Sweeps starting with both pistols then the rifle, ending with shotgun on four pipes, knock down with a clay bird. Stage 4 is the bar and

Stage 8 had you engaging the pistol target with ten rounds any way you wanted. Rifle target with ten rounds on large buffalo. Shotgun play a tune on the gongs with four rounds. Luckily for some shooters, major malfunc- tions waited until the last stage.
