THE FIELD OF HONOR

Boot hill, better known in polite parlance as a cemetery, remains today the single thing of permanence to remind us of the violence that was once a part of the hard-bitten mining camps in which it flourished.

Hasty words, imagined insults, cheating at cards, and even more often, the jumping of claims, resulted in rather fatal consequences for those who were "slow on the draw." The first twenty-six graves which formed the nucleus for Virginia City's sizable cemetery resulted from this quick form of "lead poisoning."

But there were instances in which such disputes were settled by the more gentlemanly form ... a carry over, no doubt, from the strong southern influence which was present in practically every boom mining region of Nevada. In fact, dueling became such a fad in the sixties that it was outlawed by statute and every public office holder was required to assert in his sworn oath that he had never actively participated in a duel, either as a principal or a second. Apparently legal aspects failed to curb the appetite for this manner of settling differences and many were the instances in which opponents met on a hillside or in a secluded ravine in the grey morning hours to uphold their beliefs on the field of honor.

Usually a slug in the leg, the thigh or the arm was deemed sufficient reprisal, but it was not always so. As late as 1876 when Jefferson Canyon in Nye county was at its mining peak this gentlemanly form of homicide took place in the true

sense of the word.

An argument arose between two citizens of Jefferson and it was agreed that the matter should be settled with pistols. As per arrangement they met in the early morning at the place designated by seconds and were informed that each was to walk 25 steps in the opposite direction and then commence firing. Evidently the strain was too much, or else he miscounted; at any rate one of the adversaries turned on completion of the seventeenth step, took aim and fired. His pistol jammed and he found himself facing the deliberate aim of his opponent a split second before the fatal bullet struck him.

In the eyes of a grand jury that was summoned to investigate, the law is all right when it applies . . . the members failed to bring an indictment against the victor.
