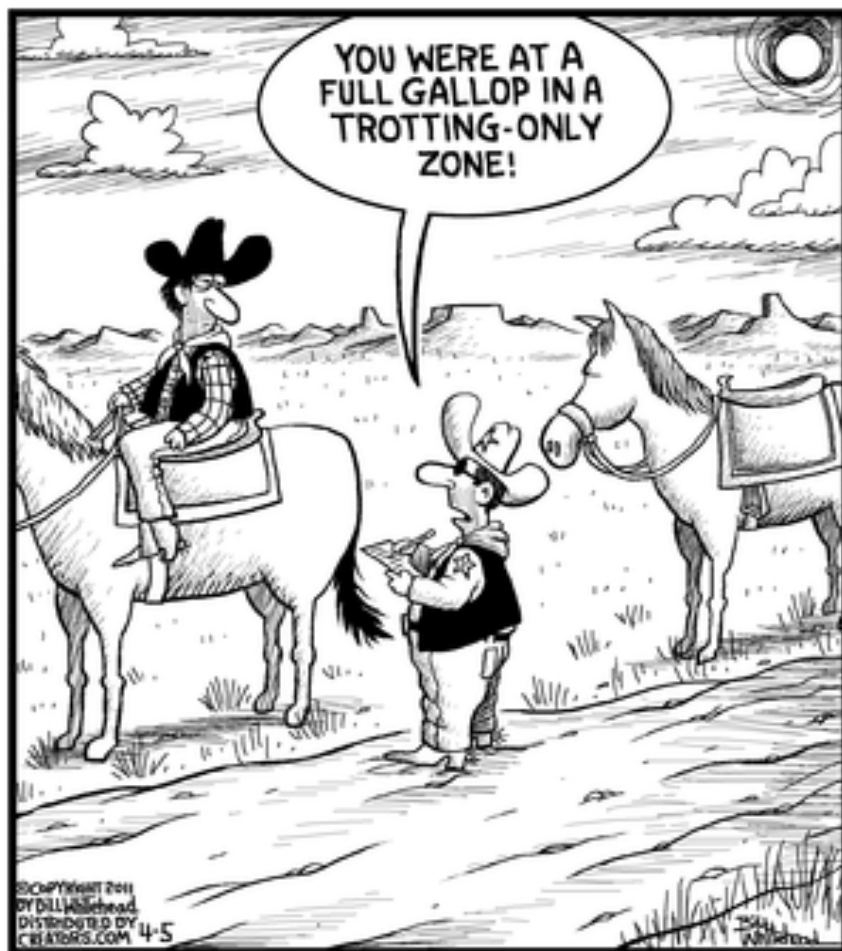
Howdy all,

COMSTOCK TRAFFIC

It was November 14, 1885, and the good people of Virginia City were all excited about the reckless driving and dangerous traffic on the Comstock. There was even talk of a safety program! And then came a traffic accident which set the whole territory on its ears.

Virginia City is built on a steep hill, and streets running down it are virtual cliffs. Fill these narrow thoroughfares with excited teams and anything could happen. Down from C Street ran D Street, where deliveries were made to the

rear doors of many important C street hotels, restaurants, and stores, and to the front doors of more dubious forms of enterprise along D Street.

The morning of November 14th a swill cart, piled high with barrels of garbage rattled down D Street. Something frightened the nervous horse and he bolted, bit in teeth. Two boys were driving the swill cart, and one of them, young Martin, instantly leaped to safety. But Pat Hanifan stuck to the seat. Between Sutton and Union streets the swill cart reached a terrific speed, and at that moment, plunged broadside into an overloaded vegetable wagon, creaking behind a laboring four-horse team.

The splintering crash could be heard clear up on the Divide! Tons of garbage and fresh vegetables were littered for scores of yards in all directions.

Young Hanifan was catapulted from the swill cart, landing on his head and suffering a long scalp wound and bruises about the legs. The swill cart rebounded several feet in the air, hurling additional garbage into the doors and windows of several buildings. The blow killed one of the wheel horses on the vegetable wagon and dashed the two riders, Luigi Picietti and Natale Menante, to the ground. Picietti's leg was fractured and Menante dislocated an ankle and suffered bruises on the face. Both men were immediately given first aid by Dr. Zangerle, who announced they would soon be up and about.

Meanwhile, the remaining horses of the vegetable wagon team went completely hysterical and began to plunge violently, dragging the shattered wagon and dying wheeler across Sutton Avenue. There spectators seized them and quieted them, until they were soon unhitched and led away quietly.

The vegetable wagon and team belonged to "Black John," an Italian rancher "on the Carson River below Gooneys." The swill cart was the predecessor of the garbage collector of today, but instead of paying to have garbage removed, it was deemed a favor to the person who gathered it, to "give him your swill" for his hogs. Regular collectors of swill were always on hand and actually competed for the privilege of hauling away garbage.
