
Howdy all,

### PANAMINT BULLION

Next in a series from Harold's Club Pioneer Nevada Supplied by Slow Eddy

Probably nowhere in the west outside the walls of a penitentiary were so many desperadoes congregated as in the Panamint area during the seventies.

Near enough to Death Valley to afford numerous hideouts, yet far enough from larger cities where law enforcement was becoming increasingly necessary, Panamint offered the excitement of a prosperous mining camp coupled with a certain sense of security for those whose reputations were somewhat shady.

Early locators, almost to a man, were rather tough characters, and the town's cemetery. Sour Dough canyon, was well filled with the gravestones of those who weren't quick enough on the draw! Some of the early investors, who purchased claims from the "shady" element found themselves owning more than they had bargained for. In one instance a group of investors, upon purchasing some Panamint property, found themselves confronted with a claim from Wells Fargo Company because of the original owner's former depredations, and syndicate paid off an additional twelve thousand dollars to Wells Fargo to obtain clear title.

Largest investors in Panamint properties were Senators John P. Jones and William Stewart who formed the Panamint Mining Company with capital stock of two million dollars. They paid approximately a quarter of a million dollars for some of the more prominent claims to get the company into production.

The two senators along with their mining operators soon realized

that they had purchased something of a "pig in a poke." The town continued to be a hangout for desperadoes, and many of the original owners, who had sold their claims, remained in the vicinity noting the mining milling developments with avid interest. It was apparent that the major problems would not be limited to the production of ore, but would encompass the peril of safely transporting the bullion to market.

After due deliberation, following a request for service from Senator Stewart, Wells Fargo Company "guessed not" on Panamint. Company officials evidently felt the district was too tough, and that the hazards of transporting the bullion through a country where so many bandits waited,

wasn't worth the risk of service. Disheartened by the Wells Fargo turndown, Senator Stewart did not give up hope.

Since there was only one road out of Panamint, Stewart realized that bandits intent on robbery of the bullion in transportation would necessarily have to carry the stuff by mule back to evade being Hence he developed a caught. scheme which worked. ordered several large molds, and when milling commenced, the bullion was poured into the molds, emerging in huge round balls, weighing 750 pounds each. Such was the weight and shape of the valuable bullion that bandits were unable to load it onto mules, and after one attempt at robbery, they gave up in disgust. In fact, they called upon Stewart and other mine owners and roundly cursed them for the scheme which so thoroughly put an end to their own well laid robbery plans.

Laughingly, the teamsters employed by mine owners, moved each wagon load through the town and to safe destination, without even so much as a guard. Panamint was tough, but the tough element lacked the brains to cope with mine operators.


